Driven by the desire to create a low-cost, customer focused commercial investment castings company, John founded Post Precision Castings, Inc. in 1964. Now the primary employer in Strausstown, Pennsylvania, Post Precision Castings has grown from a unique forerunner in commercial castings

to a 150,000 square-foot facility with over 130 employees. In 2012, John was the recipient of the Medallion for Entrepreneurship from the International Honor Society, Beta Gamma Sigma.

John was also a strong supporter of Holy Name High School, where both of his children graduated. His support included the dedication of the Franco-Post Auditorium, which seats over 700.

It has been another tremendous year at Berks Catholic. The Saints of 2014 will matriculate at some of the most selective schools in the country including the United States Naval Academy, Brown University, University of Pennsylvania, University of Notre Dame, Syracuse University Newhouse School of Communications, Virginia Tech, St. Joseph's University, Lehigh, Lafayette, University of Rochester, Penn State University,

Catholic University, Georgia, Villanova and Wake Forest, as well as our great local colleges and universities, just to name a few. They have been invited to and will attend Honors colleges at places like Boston College, St. Joe's, IUP, Philadelphia University and Temple, as well as being admitted early to Medical School and an O.T. Masters program at Thomas Jefferson University. Eleven student athletes will continue their basketball, field hockey, football, lacrosse, soccer and track careers at NCAA Division 1, 2, and 3 institutions.

Students are also discerning the Priesthood and religious life. They will serve our country in the United States Marine Corps and United States Navy. They will enter the workforce, pursue their passions by training in technical schools and prepare for careers such as cosmetologists and airplane pilots, and even pursue gap years of service.

So, yes, the Class of 2014, our newest alumni, have much to be proud of! 93% of the 2014 Saints will continue their education at 2- or 4-year Colleges & Universities and have earned over \$10.12 million in total scholarships. They have completed over 10,000 hours of service in soup kitchens, food banks, tutoring and mentoring Olivet children, Habitat for Humanity outreach and dozens of other causes.


School wide we have completed our Middle States Accreditation, which has taken place over the past 18 months, and we have been unanimously recommended for accreditation through 2021. The areas of focus will be increased interdisciplinary collaboration, increased critical reading of non-fiction across all disciplines, and continued emphasis on an already strong sense of family at Berks Catholic by increasing awareness and practice of personal responsibility by all students, faculty and administration.

And our Board has embarked on an aggressive strategic planning process that will encompass Academic Excellence, Catholic Identity, Development, Enrollment, Facilities and Finance to set our course into the Future.


The Class of 2014 received a total of 508 offers of admission to 157 different colleges in 29 different states and students from the Class of 2014 were offered admission to honors programs at various


Competition, where she was named

His current position is a Propulsion Engineer in Boeing Phantom Works. Juan talks about his career path as well as his time at Holy Name and how it helped pave the way to a successful engineering career.

Career Path

"After graduating from Holy Name High School in 2006, I completed my Bachelor's degree in Aerospace Engineering at Georgia Institute of Technology in 2010. In addition to course work, I performed research for the Air Force Research Lab, DARPA, and Boeing. I also completed an internship at NASA Ames in Mountain View, CA in 2008.

"After graduating with my Bachelor's, I interned in Boeing Research and Technology (BR&T) in Seattle, WA, before pursuing my Master's in Aerospace Engineering at Georgia Tech. During my internship, I decided to pursue a career with Boeing and returned to BR&T after completing my Master's degree. At BR&T, I worked for three years on a variety of commercial, defense, and government projects including 737 Max, Phantom Eye, and NASA N+2 Low Boom Supersonic.

"I recently relocated to St. Louis, MO, to accept a new position in Boeing Phantom Works. In my new role, I am a propulsion designer for advanced military air vehicles."

"My Holy Name education was a critical part of the path to where I am today. At Holy Name, I was able to build the work ethic and discipline required for the rigors of my degrees in Engineering. I also entered Georgia Tech with an excellent foundation in Math and Science, thanks to the stellar faculty at Holy Name including, but not limited to, Mrs. Buchanan, Mrs. Einolf, Miss Murphy, and Mrs. Moult.

"Recently, I have begun to appreciate other parts of my Holy Name education. I held leadership positions in extracurricular

activities at Holy Name, which helped me to develop leadership skills that I have built on both at Georgia Tech and at Boeing. I was also able to develop strong interpersonal skills, which are key differentiators in my field."

"Work hard in all your classes; you will be surprised how valuable that knowledge becomes later on in your career and life. Make sure to find things you are passionate about and develop those interests with others who share the same energy."

hobbies are single engine flying, mountaineering, and hiking. Juan also enjoys volunteering in STEM outreach organizations in schools and communities.






Alumni Updates

Mary Anne (Post) Bell (HN 2002) and her husband, Drew, had a baby girl, Amelia, on September 23, 2013.



What is Extravaganza? Extravaganza is the annual major fundraiser for Berks Catholic, worked on year round and on average raising \$150,000 to \$200,000. On the night before the Auction, a Wine and Cheese Preview night is held. All donors and parents are invited to be guests of the school for refreshments and the opportunity to bid on all Silent Auction items, plus a special "Preview Night" booth of items and homeroom baskets for that night only. On Extravaganza night, Cocktail hour is followed by a gourmet dinner in our gym, which has been transformed into a spectacular venue, according to the year's theme. During dinner, a Live Auction is held with over 50 major items, ranging from jewelry to furniture to vacation trips and more.

Meanwhile, six Silent Auction booths, filled with almost 700 smaller items in categories covering everything imaginable, are open for bidding. Over the past 30+ years, Extravaganza has raised over \$4 million for our catholic high school. The key to Extravaganza's success is through the cooperation and generosity of parents, alumni and Berks County's business community. And with this success comes the continued commitment to high-quality, faith-based education for all our students.

A special thank you to all who contributed, volunteered and attended Extravaganza 2013. It was a great success and raised over \$171,000 net. An additional \$46,000 was donated to the Emotional Appeal, and was used to upgrade a science lab and security cameras and to purchase a nine-passenger van. Gifts of Stock

If you have owned a stock for more than 12 months and it has appreciated in value during that time, you would incur a capital gains tax by selling it. However, if you give that stock to Berks Catholic as a gift, you avoid the capital gains tax and can also claim an income tax deduction for the full fair market value of the gift up to an amount equal to 30% of your adjusted gross income. Any unused deduction may be carried forward for up to five years. Electronic transfers of shares of publicly traded stock and mutual funds shares of publicly traded companies and mutual funds may be transferred electronically to Berks Catholic.
